

The 16-19 Tuition Fund for 2021 to 2022 Academic Year Statement

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is being extended for 2021 to 2022 academic year. This is ring fenced funding for schools, colleges and all other 16 to 19 providers to mitigate the disruption to learning caused by coronavirus (COVID-19).

The fund provides additional funding for schools, colleges and other 16 to 19 providers against the disruption to the learning. Reflections priority focus is to meet the learner needs and to fulfil their full potential within the study programme 16-19 curriculum. With this additional support needs may be identified and could fall within the following, learners that have not achieved a grade 4 or 5 in English and/or maths or have a grade 4 or above in English and/or maths, from an economically disadvantaged background that may require catch-up support within additional learning activities set.

This will be offered through small group tuition in English, maths and other subjects that have been disrupted, including vocational and/or academic learning. We will ensure all considerations are applied and made with learners with special educational needs and disabilities where learning and education has been disrupted.

The tuition fund will be used to support learners achieving learning above and beyond the already structured delivery plan. Each learner will have identified needs through their individual learning plan and outlined within their support plan. This will address the learner's specific needs and individual circumstances in meeting these.

This supported delivery will be made up of a mix of teaching and learning styles, inclusive of but not limited to small group delivery of a group of 3 and not exceeding 5, one-to-one delivery with dedicated skills support tutor and support resources in testing and achieving the knowledge and skills set required.
